- There are two main sections in the Bible. The Old Testament tells us about the time before Jesus. The New Testament tells us about Jesus and the beginning of the Church. Some of the books are called by the name of the person thought to have written them: Mark, Jeremiah, Peter.
- The parish family listens to God's Word in the Gospel.
- The lectionary which is used at Mass contains the scriptures used by the community throughout the year.
