<p><u>Key Vocabulary</u></p> <p><b>Apostle</b> An important Christian teacher or missionary. Each of the 12 disciples of Jesus Christ are apostles.</p> <p><b>community</b> A community is a group of living things sharing the same environment.</p> <p><b>Good News</b> The Good News is the message of Jesus, the Christ or Messiah — God's ruler promised by the Scriptures</p> <p><b>parish</b> A parish is a Christian community in a geographical area. It usually has its own church and priest.</p> <p><b>serve/ service</b> To perform duties or services for God/ Jesus/ Christianity.</p> <p><b>Laitiy</b> Lay people are ordinary people who volunteer for the church.</p> <p><b>pastoral area</b> A pastoral area is a cluster of neighbouring parishes that support each other and share the collaborative gifts and talents of each parish.</p> <p><b>deanery</b> A deanery is either the area covered by a dean or the home of a dean.</p>	<p><u>I can explain what these key words mean</u></p>	<p><u>Scripture Readings</u></p> <p>Romans 12: 8-11  Mark 3: 13-19  Acts 6: 2-13; 7: 57-60</p>
