<b>Identified areas of relative strength for 2022/2023</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Progression map and SSP resources has boosted staff confidence in delivering the PE curriculum, particularly dance, gymnastics and invasion games which was historically identified as a weakness.</li> <li>Evidence of retrieval practice being used in each PE lesson.</li> <li>YMCA follow the SSP resources to deliver their weekly PE lessons which allows for consistency in progression and development of skills in each area of the PE curriculum.</li> <li>Development of the boys and girls football teams this year with great attendance at all training sessions as well as football events and festivals.</li> <li>All year groups have the opportunity to attend different sporting events and festivals within the Trust (e.g. SRSCMAT Swimming Gala) and Derby City.</li> <li>Running tracks on the field have encouraged more movement during break and lunchtimes.</li> </ul>
