Topic Homework in Year 3: Stone Age

<p>Letter</p> <p>Imagine you have travelled back in time to the Stone Age. Write a letter back to your family to tell them about your experiences. Use different conjunctions to extend sentences E.g. while, so, if, as... Use different sentence types e.g. statements, commands, exclamations and questions</p>	<p>Jewellery</p> <p>Make your own Stone Age jewellery using salt dough and twine. Using salt dough you can shape your beads into animal teeth, bones or even shells. Don't forget to decorate it with paint or carve a design on to your beads. https://www.imagininghistory.co.uk/post/stone-age-jewellery-craft</p>	<p>Compare your life with the life of a child in prehistoric Britain. Was there anything that was the same as life today? You might like to write a list or draw a table to explain your ideas. What was different? What was the same? (Homes, families, food, towns, education)</p>
<p>Poem</p> <p>Write an acrostic poem about the Stone Age. Remember to include historical information and as a challenge try to include some rhyme.</p>	<p>Tools</p> <p>Create your own tool from the Stone Age. Think carefully about which materials you will use, how you can cut and shape materials and decorate it effectively. https://www.imagininghistory.co.uk/post/stone-age-axe-craft</p>	<p>Village</p> <p>Create a model or an A3 picture of a Stone Age village or shelter. Try to make sure you find out what these dwellings were really like and include facts around your model</p>
<p>Research anything that you find interesting about the Stone Age. Think about a creative way to share your knowledge with others. E.g. A large poster, a presentation, or a game.</p>	<p>Cave Paintings</p> <p>What would Stone Age people do on long winter nights stuck in a cave? Sounds pretty boring.
