## **Parking:**

One issue that has been highlighted on the parental surveys we have received so far is parking in the morning and after school.

To keep all of our children safe please:

- Do not pull into the driveway of the school to drop off/ pick up or stop by the end of the drive to do this.
- Park so that the traffic can continue to flow with respect to our neighbours.
- Do not do 3 point turns in the road or use the driveway to turn around.
- Drive at a slower speed when around the school on Alvaston Street.

While we are very aware the school's authority ends at the gate, by all following these simple guidelines, we will make the start and end of the day safer for all of our school's children. I am aware, in the past, the school were able to put cones at the end of the drive to further encourage this, however, we are not able to block the entrance into the nursery.
